SIX YEAR MOLARS

The first permanent tooth to make its appearance in the mouth, according to a recent statement by the U. S. Public Health Service, is the six-year molar. This tooth comes through the gums just back of the last temporary tooth, one on each side of the jaw, above and below. It usually makes its appearance at about the sixth year and is often mistaken for a temporary tooth and many times allowed to decay because of the belief that it will soon be removed anyway.

This permanent tooth was partly formed even before the child was born. Every single factor which had any influence on the health or nutrition of this child during the first four or five years of his life is reflected in the development of this tooth. The size of the molar before the child was born is determined during the nursing period. An infant's health and ability to resist late life food poisoning, childhood ailments, and many times adult ailments, all have an important bearing on the quality and location of this tooth. Teeth are made of lime, phosphorus and magnesium. These are the bones of the teeth and if these were not supplied in the proper amount it will be reflected in the development of the child as well as in his temporary and permanent teeth. The child's diet and his ability to properly assimilate food will determine to a very great extent whether the enamel which should entirely cover the tooth, will be hard and properly formed or a soft, hammer stone or silky, uneven and subject to decay.

Any sickness of childhood during these early years before this permanent tooth has erupted is usually the cause of some imperfection in the enamel. Measles, scarlet fever, diphtheria, smallpox, chickenpox, in fact nearly any of the so-called childhood diseases leave their imprint upon this six-year molar and many times cause it to be so much decayed that it is extremely difficult to keep it free from

and the six-year molar comes in too crowded. It is going to seriously crowd the positions of all the teeth that are to come in front of it. Some of them may come in twisted sideways or overlap the teeth next to them and the mouth will have a crooked, crooked appearance. This may not seem of importance, but it seriously handicaps the whole balance or occlusion of the mouth, and although the teeth of the lower and upper jaws may never show the mouth is closed. It has caused what dentists call malocclusion, by use of the teeth do not fit properly one against the other.

In later years this may help to cause serious diseases. If the soft tissue of the mouth because of the irregularities of the teeth, they cannot easily be kept clean, or because certain teeth strike together with force applied in the wrong direction.

HAVE YOU A BABY?

If you want your baby to stay well and strong, if you read carefully and practice the following simple rules, especially during the warm summer months.

IF YOU WANT YOUR BABY TO STAY WELL AND STRONG:

Nurse your baby regularly every three hours, 2 1/2 to 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 12, 3, 4, 5 and 2 1/2 a. m. from birth until the fourth month, then every four hours.

DO NOT give baby anything but mother's milk, except if you must. **DO NOT** give your baby sweets of any kind, as sugar, candy, syrup, cakes, fruit, or any kind, as peaches, apples, bananas, whole grapes, plums, etc. Give orange juice in water, diluted or the third month.

DO NOT let the baby sleep in a bed with any one. Put him in a box or basket bed or kiddie camp of his own.

DO NOT let your baby suck his thumb or peddle or anything else, but his

finger. **DO NOT** let flies get on your baby. They bring sickness. Cover him with mosquito net.

No baby should have breast milk after ONE year. Ask your doctor how to feed the baby the right kind of food. If there is no doctor, ask your county health department.

DO NOT get hot, if possible. Avoid it when nursing your baby. **DO NOT** let your baby nurse every time it cries; leave him quietly in bed until he settles down.

If your baby cries frequently and is not gaining, consult your doctor. If you have not enough milk for your baby consult your doctor.

If your baby vomits or has diarrhea, stop all food. Do exactly as your doctor tells you.

See that your baby gets plenty of clean water between feedings. Keep your baby clean and cool. Always dress according to the weather.

If your baby is bottle fed, boil bottles after each feeding, wash bottles and keep in a closed jar in a weak solution of soda water.

Wash your hands and all articles necessary for the growth of your baby as it is for the growth of flowers.

WEIGHT your baby at least once a month. Visit your family doctor or your county health department to keep your baby well.






