



Location of the Clinchfield Coke Corporation on Meade Park. This operation is expected to yield more than 1,000,000 tons of bituminous coal yearly when fully developed. Tunnel work is being done by the Western Construction Company, of St. Louis, and Cotell Construction Company handled the grade work at the Jenking end.

Although installation of large coal operations along the Floyd county sector of the new railway is problematical, rail facilities supplied are considered almost a guarantee of coal development in a small scale above Wayland in the form of numerous track mines.
