# The Duties of Sheriffs As Described By the Kentucky Statutes, are as follows:

1. To conserve peace, enforce the law, appre-hend and arrest persons charged with crimes, inves-tigate violations of the law and protect persons and property of citizens of the county. 2. To execute and return all processes and or-ders of the court.

7. To visit and inspect dance halls, rondbouses and restaurants at least once each month, and to re-port his conclusions to County Attorney and Circuit Court Clerk for submission to grand jury.

8. Every Sheriff shall, upon request, deliver to the person from whom fees are demanded, or to his agent, an account stating distinctly every item of the demand, and offer to give a receipt for same, before he may make distress therefor.

9. Each Sheriff shall keep an accurate account of all fees collected by him from all sources. The clerk issuing the process in a civil case shall keep an accurate account of all fees paid to the Sheriff for the execution thereof, and report the amount to the fiscal court, which shall record it for the purpose of determining the amount of the Sheriff's annual in-come.

# COMPENSATION OF SHERIFF

The Sheriff shall be allowed by the Department of Revenue, for collecting state taxes, a commission of ten per cent upon the first five thousand dollars and four per cent upon the state treasury each year.

2. He shall be allowed by the county treasurer, for collecting the county revenue, ten per cent upon the first five thousand dollars collected, and four per cent upon the residue. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1951, the Sherifl of Floyd county received under this provision the sum of \$9,970.31.

3. The Sheriff of Floyd county presently re-ceives 2½ per cent of all school taxes collected in Floyd county. The amout paid the Sheriff of Floyd county for school taxes collected for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1951, was \$11.678.86.

4. The exact amount paid the Sheriff by the fiscal court in addition to above is not known, but it is understood to have been approximately \$3,000.00 for the year ending June 30, 1951.
