- THE KIWANAS CLUB WAS MENTIONED & THE SUCCESS IT
 SEEMINGLY ATTAINS - IF SOME THOUGHT WAS GIVEN
 TO THIS IT MIGHT BE UNDERSTOOD (| BELIEVE OUR LIONS
 CLUB WOULD HAVE SURVIVED IF THE MEMBERS HAD BEEN
 INTERESTED ENOUGH TO PAY FOR MEALS IN ADDITION TO
 THE ASSESSED DUES.
- (4) THE DESIRABILITY OF A PLACE TO MEET WAS ALSO MENTIONED AND SOME SUGGESTIONS WERE PUT FORWARD.
